Identify	To establish what something is or who someone is.	I can identify the girl who took my pen.
Establish	To set something up on a permanent basis.	The teacher established the rules of the classroom on the first day.
Inclusive	To include everyone and treat them fairly and equally.	Our aim is to create an inclusive society.
Culture	The ideas, customs and behavior of a certain group.	Food is an important part of my culture.
Appropriate	Suitable for the circumstances.	It would be appropriate to wear a suit to an interview.
Community	A group of people with shared attitudes and interests.	People in the community wanted a bigger play area for the children.
Distinct	Something that stands out.	He had a very distinct hair colour.
Dialect	Use of certain words or language that is specific to a certain group.	The Manchester dialect is different to that of London.
Influence	To have an effect on the behavior or attitude of others.	My best friend is a huge influence in my life.
Diversity	A range of different things.	We have created diversity in the workplace.
Suggest	To put forward an idea for consideration.	I suggest that we make posters for the campaign.
Reference	To mention something.	The teacher made reference to the knowledge organiser.
Extended metaphor	A metaphor which is used throughout a poem or a novel.	The rose is an extended metaphor for the love the poet feels towards his subject.
Offensive	Causing someone to feel upset by something you have done or said.	I found your comment very offensive.
Nostalgia	A fond memory and desire to return to a place.	My old house brought a sense of nostalgia for my childhood.
Impact	To have a strong effect on someone or something.	My first lesson had a positive impact on my day.
Perceive	To interpret or regard someone or something in a particular way.	He did not perceive himself as a good actor but he auditioned for the school play.

Relevant	Appropriate to the current time or circumstance.	This book is very relevant to what is happening in my life at the moment.
Restrict	To put a limit on something or control it.	My parents restrict the amount of time I spend on my phone at night.
Alternative	Another possible choice.	If I miss my bus, I could take the train as an alternative.
Contribute	To help or assist in achieving something.	I contribute some of my spare time to help my elderly nextdoor neighbor.
Emphasis	To give something special importance or value.	The teacher placed great emphasis on our assessment.
Technique	A particular way of carrying out a skill.	A particular technique is used to create a colourful effect.
Interact	To be involved directly.	It is important that you interact with the rest of your group.
Label	To classify or categorise something.	I feel like people label me as a trouble maker.
